Together with Richard Hooker's *Laws of Ecclesiasticall Politie* (published the same year, in fact), Junius's *Mosaic Polity* offers about the best guide one could ask for through this hermeneutical maze. Responding to the agitations of 16th-century proto-theonomists, Junius argues unambiguously against the idea that contemporary polities must adopt the laws of Moses, yet never dismisses these laws as obsolete and irrelevant.

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
